

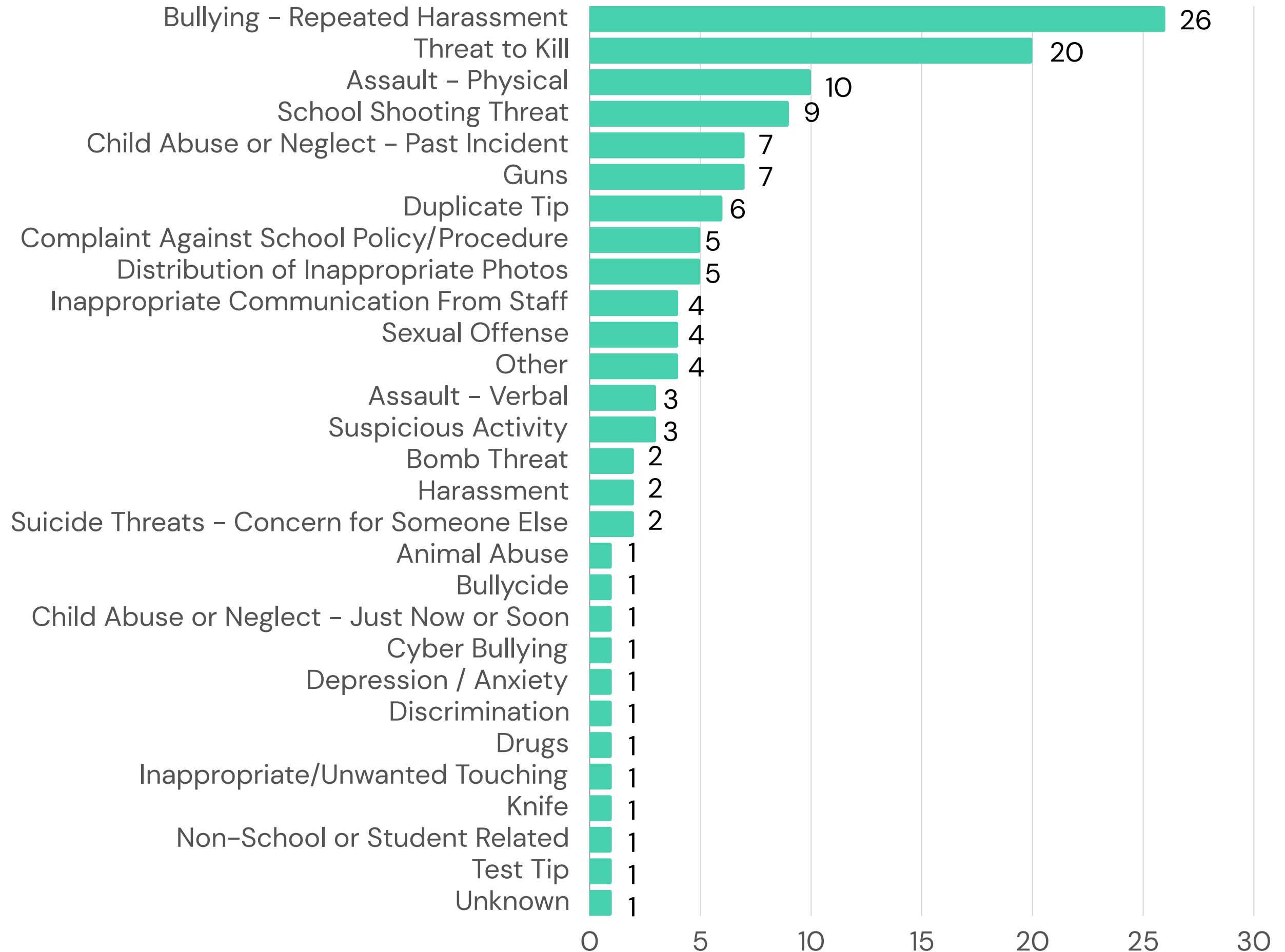

APRIL 2024 TIP SUMMARY

In April 2024,
Courage2Report received
131 tips.

Compared to last year
(**140** tips in April 2023), we
saw a **6.43%** decrease in
activity.

**Bullying – Repeated
Harassment** was the
number one most reported
tip type this month, same
as April 2023.



TIPS BY THE DAY

In April, **Tuesday** was the day of the week when the most tips were reported. This is a change from March when most tips were received on a Thursday.

TIPS BY THE HOUR

The most tips were received between **12:00 PM and 1:00 PM**. However, tips were steadily received between the hours of 9:00 AM and 8:00 PM.

PREFERRED WAY TO SUBMIT TIPS

The most popular way to submit a tip in April was from a **computer's web browser**.

HANDLEWITHCARE (HWC)

In April 2024, we received **30** HandleWithCare tips.

In April 2023, we received a total of **17** HandleWithCare tips.

The "HandleWithCare" Model:

If a law enforcement officer encounters a child during a call, child's information is forwarded to the school before the school bell rings the next day. The school may implement individual, class and whole school traumasensitive curricula so that traumatized children are "Handled With Care." If a child needs more intervention, on-site trauma-focused mental healthcare is available at the school.

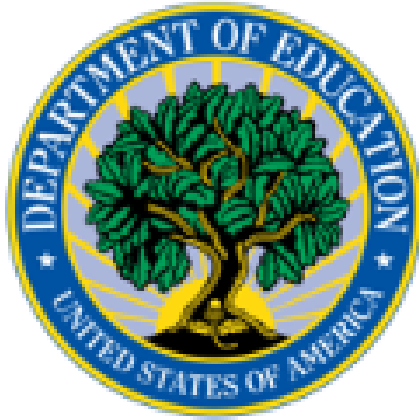

Human Trafficking in **AMERICA'S SCHOOLS**



No Cost Training

Today's educators are in a unique position to reach youth who may be vulnerable to exploitation and human trafficking. They see youth every day in their schools, learn about their lives, and can be safe spaces for students who need help. Youth survivors of trafficking and exploitation have specialized needs and experiences, and the adults who work with them need to be trauma-informed and tuned-in to recognize when something is wrong in a students' life and how to talk with them about it. This webinar will highlight best practices and resources for K-12 educators on just that: how to talk with youth about human trafficking and exploitation. We will have brief presentations featuring specifically designed resources including graphic novels for youth from the Office for Victims of Crime, and a guide for youth practitioners from the Blue Campaign. We will also have a panel discussion with two educators working with youth in high schools in Chicago and rural Missouri as well as two youth speakers who are actively involved in using the arts in anti-trafficking outreach efforts. The webinar will conclude with an audience Q&A.
